GPA - what is that?

Grade Point Average: the average of all earned grades in high school credit courses.

A list of all high school credit courses taken and the earned grade in each course; includes the GPA.

- Use good study habits realizing all course results are now considered for graduation and college admissions.
- Participate in extracurricular activities (think quality, not quantity).
- Explore summer opportunities.
